

## Scrappy Log Cabin

This version calls for strips to be precut. I find this makes for more accurate blocks, less trimming. Use a variety of scraps for the strips for the blocks.

### Fabric Requirements for lap size top:

Blocks: 20 dark 2" strips (44" width of fabric) or equivalent

20 light 2" strips (35" width of fabric) or equivalent

1 red 2" strip (40" width of fabric) or equivalent

Borders: 1+1/2 yards for outer border

10" for inner border (at least 40" width of fabric)

Binding: 14" (at least 40" width of fabric)



### Cutting:

Dark strips: Cut 20 pieces for each length listed, keep cut pieces sorted by length for ease of assembly. 11", 9", 8", 6", 5", 3" (In example I tried to use a different fabric for all the pieces of the same length)

Light strips: Same as dark, but lengths are different. 9+1/2", 8", 6+1/2", 5", 3+1/2", 2"

Red strip: Cut 20 2" squares

Outer border: Cut length of fabric, 4 strips, 6+1/2" wide.

Inner border: Cut 5 strips, 2" wide

Binding: Cut 6 strips, 2 1/4" wide

### Assembly:

See the diagrams for order of assembling the pieces. Start with the red center, then add on piece #1, press away from the center. Add on piece #2, press, continue till all pieces are added. If you get the block reversed, that's OK, just make all blocks in the same manner.

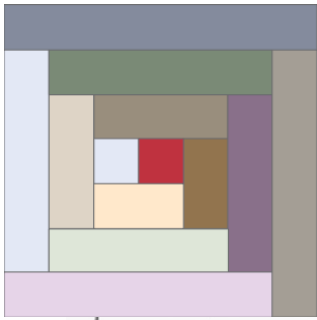
The blocks should measure about 11 x 11 once they are completed. Measure the blocks to see if they are all the same size. Trim if necessary.

Arrange the blocks in any appealing 4 x 5 layout you desire.

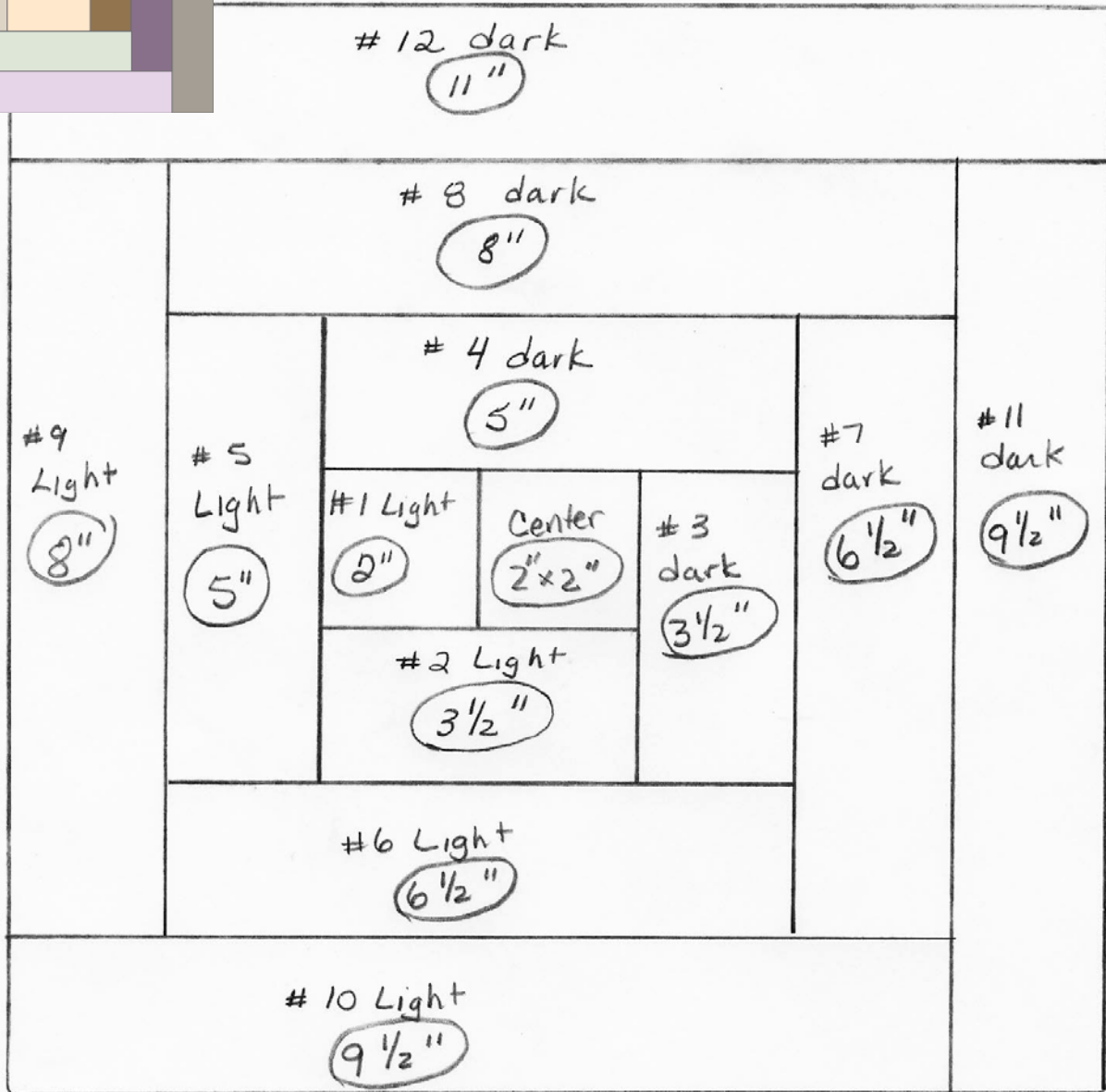
Next add the narrow border, long sides first. As you add the borders, be sure to measure the length and width carefully and cut the borders to fit. Then add the wide borders, also long sides first, measuring and cutting carefully.

Piece the binding pieces together.
